The purpose of this Social Media Policy is to cover all aspects of social media use and the involvement for all members during their time and membership with the Mindarie Netball Club. Mindarie Netball Club recognises that social media networks like Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Snapchat, TikTok etc. are highly used by many of our club members.

It is extremely important that all Mindarie Netball Club members understand that any form of information shared amongst social media networks can be traced and accessed at any time. MDNC advises all members to take into consideration and think about what they are posting on social media networks online or otherwise into the public domain and whether it impacts another member or the club.

Under no circumstances should bullying, harassing, offensive comments or disparaging remarks be made about any coach, team manager, team member or executive committee member be made over social media pages. If an issue arises over social media, please see our Complaints Policy.

Listed below are guidelines that are to be followed by all members of the Mindarie Netball Club in relation to the social media network community:

- It is unacceptable to disparage the Mindarie Netball Club, the committee or any members when involved in social media networks
- No Mindarie Netball Club member shall take part in any social media networks in such way that negatively impacts another member or their effectiveness and productivity
- Whilst involved in social media networks, no member shall imply that any personal comments made are endorsed in any way by the Mindarie Netball Club
- All members must not disclose any confidential information belonging to the Mindarie Netball Club
- A committee member needs to be on all team pages

Any breach of this Social Media Policy may result in disciplinary action.
